Secretary's Scribbles



Rehearsals for 'The Wedding Singer' are now well under way and it is fantastic to see such a depth of talent in the people who are preparing for the show both on and off stage. Already there have been countless hours put in towards making this show the energetic and visual spectacular it will be. It has been very cold during rehearsals at HAC House in the last few weeks. Quite the difference from the heat that we experienced during rehearsals for the 50th Spectacular rehearsals. It is not unusual to see your breath misting out into the air as you sing, and the usual appearance of the winter cough and cold has started to make its dreaded appearance. With this in mind I thought I would research some suggestions on vocal care during the winter months.

The number one recommendation in maintaining your vocal health regardless of the weather, is hydration. Drink lots of fluids, particularly water to keep yourself hydrated, dehydration means that your vocal chords are less flexible and won't work as well. Oh and sorry ladies and gentlemen, apparently Friday night drinks do not count....so water, water, water. Warm drinks are also recommended as being great for the throat, although avoiding caffeine is suggested, and I write this knowing that caffeine is a must for some of us to function, so, do your best. Wear a scarf. Help keep your throat physically warm. Along with this suggestion, make sure you are vocally well warmed up before singing. This will aid in preventing vocal stress and strain, like stretching before dancing. It might even be a good idea to start warming up in the car before you get to rehearsal, a long vocal warm up is a plus. Rest when sick, don't push your voice when you are not well.

It might take longer to fully recover. Party wisely – this will help your voice. And get a good sleep.

There are lots of other tips and tricks that can help, but hydrate, warm up and sleep are probably the most important. So as we work and play hard through rehearsals, look after your body, and as part of your body, look after your voice.

If you're like me, and I'm sure that many of you are, the not talking and not singing thing is always a challenge, so – good luck. 'Til next time

There are many students in the show who are members of HAC as is the director - Emily Friedrichsen-Hay.



The production is Hairspray – Junior. This musical is a family-friendly version of the popular 2007 film which in turn was an adaptation of the 2002 Broadway musical. The director, HC teacher Ms Emily Friedrichsen-Hay, also directed last year's very successful production of 'Robin Hood'.

It comprises a cast of 76 very talented and hardworking years 7 to 12 students along with some VET Dance students from St Brigid's and Murtoa Colleges who study the subject at Horsham College. There are also a number of students making up the crew working behind the scenes.

It will run at the Horsham Town Hall on Thursday 11th, Friday 12th and Saturday 13th August, at 7.30pm.

Set in 1960s Baltimore, USA, with 60s-style music, dancing, and fashion, it tells the story of chubby, vivacious dance-crazy teenager, Tracy Turnblad, who against the odds, achieves her dream of winning a spot on the young talent variety TV program, "The Corny Collins Show". Along with some friends she uses her newfound celebrity status to challenge the show's segregation policy.

THE DROWSY CHAPERONE

With an impressive representation of former Horsham students, The St Hilda's College Theatre Group presents as their 2016 production: *The Drowsy Chaperone*!

Let's transport back to the 1920's. A middle-aged, musical theatre fan plays the record of his favourite "fictional" musical *The Drowsy Chaperone* and ultimately the jazzy, outrageous show is brought to life on stage! Bringing the audience in-and-out of his fantasy, the antisocial, middle-aged man banters about the actors, songs and the crazy plotline which is unfolding right in front of him! A show filled with gangsters, showgirls, a wedding, glitzy costumes, and, of course, a drowsy chaperone, this is one musical which cannot be missed. While the 2010 MTC production featured Geoffrey Rush as the fan, the role is played by a woman in this production. As many HAC members would know, the MTC production also featured Alex Rathgeber as the groom.

The production cast is made up of current students at The University of Melbourne's residential college, St Hilda's College, and the creative team is made up of its past and present students.



Loretta Gasparini is co-director, whose most recent works in Horsham, before moving to Melbourne for study in 2013, were in Horsham College musicals. She played piano in the orchestra for both *Beauty and the Beast* (2012) and *High School Musical* (2011) and was a chorus member in *Back to the 80's* (2010).

Carl Gasparini has the role of Spanish womanizer, Aldolpho. Carl was in the HAC 50th Anniversary Spectacular and in the same year played the Sherriff of Nottingham in Horsham College's Robin Hood and The March Hare in its 2014 production of Alice in Wonderland.

Erin Krelle is an intensive dancer in the show and a highly-qualified one at that. Erin learned dancing for 15 years, studying Ballet, Hip Hop and Irish Dancing. She has danced in two Richard Morris concerts, once in a group and last year as a soloist. She was in two Horsham College productions as a chorus member; *Beauty and the Beast* (2012) and *Back to the 80's* (2010).

Sam Anders is a crew member and is a very welcome newcomer to musical theatre. He is better known for his prowess on the Wimmera football fields (Kalkee U17 Best & Fairest 2014) and for being dux of Horsham College, 2015.

This musical by Millar and Rutherford is a dramatic thriller inspired by the true story of Amber Murray- a single mother who gave up her son to John and Sarah Makin in 1892, setting in motion one of the most moving criminal trials in Australian history.

The Hatpin is a hopeful story about friendship and courage, dealing with motherhood, poverty and the resilience of women.

Performance dates are 16th to 24th September at Union Theatre, ground floor of Union House at the University of Melbourne.

SALA Goes Underground...432...

For the first time since its inception, the South Australian Living Artists Festival (SALA) goes underground at Naracoorte Caves National Park.

Travelling from Adelaide to the underground, a collective of artists from Sacred Resonance and Felicity Arts are creating a unique, hybrid audio-visual performance that unites live music and dance. The team of artists are professional creatives across the performing, visual and healing arts, and are working collaboratively by drawing inspiration from ritual, rhythm, rock art and sound frequencies - common threads that span the ages.

The work Dance Between Worlds 432 is housed in the Wet Cave at Naracoorte and offers a sublime interplay and conversation between sound, music and movement. The music transcends into deep listening with the shapes of the dance and imagery spiralling, spinning and building momentum to find abandon before returning to stillness.

In Dance Between Worlds 432 there is shadow play, overlap and tracing of the elements. The boundary between the audience and the performance is visceral.

The founders of Adelaide-based Sacred Resonance, Darren Curtis and Bradley Pitt, have been working closely with Naracoorte Caves personnel over the last two years to realise this much anticipated performance event.

After the success of the Sacred Resonance exhibition in SALA 2015 and again in this year's Adelaide Fringe Installation, Agartha, Darren says that the upcoming work is "a transformational performance in a place of sensory deprivation".

Bradley says that, "A sense of wonder and mystery awaits as the audience descends into darkness, and into the subterranean world that the Ancients saw as the mystical dimensions of the underworld."

"432 Hz is based on a natural tuning system and is known as 'nature's resonance' frequency. This is connected with the science of archaeoacoustics. In this live performance our music is tuned more to natural scales and frequencies allowing a transformational experience of live music as explored by the ancients", Darren continues.

Also part of the creative team, visual artist, Jessica Curtis says that "art is a transformative vehicle to assist in the reorientation of consciousness. This project is exactly that vehicle!"

Darren and Bradley are working closely with the artistic team which includes the multi award-winning duo of Amanda Phillips and Alexander Waite Mitchell - who also have their 360-degree virtual reality work Otanical on at the Adelaide Botanic Garden during SALA. International Choreographer and Filmmaker, Amanda Phillips says, "It's such a tremendous privilege to perform at South Australia's only World Heritage site and to reconnect and discover the primal energy and drive at the core of one's being through authentic sound, music and dance: beginning with the breath and the body in space. This body, the twinness of stillness and expansiveness, is the vessel for all of our experiences on earth".

Composer and Technologist, Alexander says, "I am looking forward to the boundlessness of the music within the Cathedral-like architecture". "Darren and I first met at Elder Conservatorium and a decade later we are collaborating on this exciting project - bringing our research and travels together."

There are only five performances of Dance Between Worlds 432 during SALA. With a limited audience capacity, the experience in the Wet Cave is intimate.

"The audience is within the experience. There are not many opportunities that match the wonderment of being within an immersive audiovisual environment that is simultaneously the history of the cave and the transience of the art", Amanda says.

Dance Between Worlds 432 is to enter the extraordinary.
