Working With Children Checks (WWCC)

From 1 January 2017, the laws have changed regarding WWC checks which affects all businesses & organisations like ours. As a result of the changes, the Horsham Town Hall are making it mandatory for all hirers to provide a valid WWC check for all volunteers & members 18 years or above as part of the hire agreement.

Consequently, if you are going to be involved with a HAC production & you are at least 18 years old, you will need to provide us with a valid WWC check. If you are in a profession that requires you to already have a similar registration, then that will suffice.

Being a voluntary organisation, the good news is that the application is free. You just need to pay to get a photo done (similar to a passport photo). Please refer to the link for an application - http://www.workingwithchildren.vic.gov.au/home/applications/. When prompted, please make sure you note down that you are a volunteer with the Horsham Arts Council. This way, we are informed when the WWC check is completed & approved.

Our secretary Faye Johns will be collating a WWC check register that we will have to ensure is 100% accurate. This register will have to be provided to the Horsham Town Hall at the commencement of any future production. This may be a pain but it has to be done.

The HAC was extremely honoured to be awarded the "Community Event of the Year" award for 2016 for its production of "HAC's 50thAnniversary Spectacular".



Where you are and what you do.

I'm Jessica Harris, I'm a Music Theatre performer making things work in Melbourne! I've recently finished a season as 'Tiffany' in 'Motormouth Loves Suckface' at Chapel Off Chapel, a new Australian musical I was lucky to be a part of, and recently performed at the TheatrePeople Sings! Industry night, and performed for a season as a Melbourne Storm Cheerleader.

Where and what you studied?

I trained at Spectrum Dance, a three year dance course on a Director's Scholarship, and a two year Music Theatre course at ShowFit: Music Theatre Initiative, on a Working Scholarship.

What made you choose the course?

The energy from the faculty at both auditions, they made me feel like they'd be safe spaces to take risks, and really develop, and be pushed to your limits with wonderful support and care.

What are the good/bad things about your course?

The bad things about training are merely financial, the long hours and level of commitment make it hard to work enough hours, and many performing courses aren't recognized by the government, so there's little support there also.

The GREAT things are the communities you graduate with, wonderful peers, mentors, and teachers. Being able to learn so many things, not only about your craft, but about yourself and the kind of performer you'd like to be, and just how much you can be capable of. (Spoiler alert, it's always so much more than you think!)

Have you continued to pursue music and performance?

Yes, always.

In what ways have you done so?

I'm a 2015 graduate, so now I take pro dance classes every week, keep up my singing training, perform at any chance I get and audition, audition, audition!

Why were the choices made that you did make?

I don't think there's ever been a 'choice' for me per se, I've never had a 'back-up' or other option! So far all my choices have just been to take every opportunity that presents itself!

Pros and cons of how you pursue the performance side of things?

The pros are the people, the community, the experiences, pushing and bettering yourself, and that feeling of fulfilment you get when it's all going well-the highs are very high!

The cons are that the lows are often very low, keeping up confidence and motivation during a lot of setbacks and rejection can really take its toll!

What do you hope to achieve in the future?

I hope to be working consistently in Music Theatre, hopefully with a reputation as a hard worker and being easy to work with!

Is there any advice that you have for people who might wish to pursue music and performance the way you do?

Just make sure you have a wonderful support network, within and without your performing world. Make sure you really, really, want it-that it's the last thing you think about before you go to sleep and the first thing when you wake up. Because you'll need that. Make sure you're willing to work as hard as you're capable of, and then some. Also SAVE!! SAVE ALL YOUR MONEY!

What shows/positions you had with HAC?

I was very lucky to be in the HAC production of Cats-a show I still adore and hope to do some day!

What you enjoyed about being involved in HAC?

HAC provided me with a safe and fun environment of discovery! Doing their production gave me the catalyst to make this my career! I'd always had such love for dancing, and never even realised I craved something more, until my first musical, when I fell head over heels for this whole crazy industry, and haven't looked back since! Thanks HAC!


Aden Beavis

The Meal Vouchers can be used at the Lions BBQ at the Memorial Hall (money raised goes to the Australian Lions Childhood Cancer Research Foundation); the afternoon tea in the Supper Room (money raised goes to The Cancer Council); or it can be used for a bar special at the Rup Pub (no drinks included).

Please make sure you are **set-up & ready for your performance** at your allotted time. You may be able to quietly & unobtrusively begin setting up while the previous performer is still singing.

The program is laid out in 30 minute blocks. We ask that you are finished & off the stage by the 30 minute mark so that the next performer is able to start on time. You are of course most welcome to have a double block if you require longer.

We will have music stands at each venue.

If you require minimal amplification, then **please bring your own**, but it must be **set up & ready to go at your allotted time**. Power is available at all venues – please bring your own leads.
