

The Curtain Comes Down On Another Year

The 2018 year has been another busy one for the HAC. Some of the key highlights are as follows;

- Australia Day 2018 On Australia Day 2018, young, talented performer Tamikah Petering represented HAC at the official HRCC event at the Horsham Soundshell. She performed the national anthem and 'We Are Australian'. She gave a great performance and gave the crowd a real treat.
- Joseph Our production of Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat was held in May 2018. The ten shows attracted an audience of 82% capacity which is a great result. There were sixty-six in the cast (including two groups of sixteen children who performed in alternate shows). Overall, approximately 147 people were involved, on- and off-stage. The show was well received by the audience and the community.



- **Orchestra Pit** We used the orchestra pit again at the Horsham Town Hall Theatre for our production of *Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat*. With thirteen musicians fitting snugly into the space, it was a real treat for the performers and audience alike.
- *Alex Rathgeber* Former HAC member, Alex Rathgeber, played the role of Tinman in the Australian professional production of *The Wizard of Oz* in May 2018. Many HAC members went down to see the show. Alex was kind enough to meet with many of them.
- Former HAC Members Former HAC members continue to thrive in amateur theatre. For example, Samantha Prollius performed in BLOC's production of Spamalot in April 2018. Rebecca Wik performed the lead role in CenterStage's production of 42nd Street in April 2018. Brady King played the role of Brittany Spears in CenterStage Geelong's production of We Will Rock You.
- Wimmera Eisteddfod Unfortunately, the Wimmera Eisteddfod was postponed in 2018 with the temporary closure of Wesley PAC. This was a real shame. I am pleased to report that a new committee has been established and the Wimmera Eisteddfod will return in 2019. The HAC will continue its sponsorship by awarding a \$100 prize to the most promising vocal student.
- Urinetown HAC originally planned to perform Urinetown in October 2018. Auditions were held but not enough men auditioned. A tough decision was made to abandon the show. This was an inspiring lesson in teamwork and working together as, very quickly, the disappointment was put aside, and plans were put in place for a replacement show. It was a credit to everyone involved.

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- *Little Shop of Horrors* Our production of *Little Shop of Horrors* was held in October 2018. Debbie and the team did a fantastic job with the show. The sets were amazing. The plants were something else. Everything about the show was fantastic. There were eighteen on-stage cast and approximately seventy people involved in total. Audience numbers were disappointing with approximately 32% capacity. This was not a reflection of the standard of the show which was incredible.
- *Music Theatre Guild of Victoria (MTGV)* The HAC received three nominations and one commendation this year for its two shows from the MTGV. This continues HAC's outstanding record of receiving recognition from the MTGV for every musical production since Cats in 2008. At the MTGV Bruce Awards on 8 December 2018 in Narre Warren, HAC won an award for Little Shop of Horrors" with Beau Ladlow and Milly Henley receiving the Peter Blizzard-Allen Design Award for the four 'Audrey 2' plants. This is a huge honour and something we should all be verv proud of.
- **Building & growing relationships** The HAC continues to build strong, working relationships with other performing arts groups including Horsham College, St Brigid's College, Horsham Primary School, Warracknabeal Primary School, BLOC, BLTS, Footlight Productions and CenterStage Geelong. This is proved by the fact that CenterStage Geelong gave us four flights of stairs and LED lights valued at over \$5,000 for free.
- New Theatre Group A new theatre group commenced in November 2018 and will operate in the performing arts sphere in the Wimmera. Whatever our thoughts about it, it is here and is our reality. It will impact on the HAC and the committee will have to plan for and around it.
- **Rock of Ages** Our next production is *Rock of Ages* which will hit the stage in May 2019 with first-time HAC director Erin Boutcher at the helm. The show is cast and is sure to be a rocking smash hit with big hair and awesome 80s' rock anthems.

It has been a huge year with many accomplishments. However, we are the first to note that we are far from perfect and can always do things better. The new committee will continue to strive to make the HAC a better place tomorrow than what it was today. I would like to sincerely thank the committee for all their hard work during the year. We have had heaps of issues to deal with and it has been a very busy and somewhat challenging time. But we all have the best interests of the HAC at heart and are passionate to see it prosper in the future.


Thank you to the HAC for all their support.


Thank You Newsletter Team

During the last weekend of October, Ronnie and I flew to Sydney for a 3-day getaway. This was something I had planned a while ago to celebrate Ronnie's 50th birthday, and as part of the trip, I booked tickets to see *Evita* at the Sydney Opera House.

We are long-time fans of Tina Arena and thought the opportunity of seeing her at an iconic venue, the Dame Joan Sutherland theatre, too good to pass up. Along with many other excited patrons from around Australia and overseas, we attended the Saturday matinee which was guaranteed to feature Tina and not the alternate. However, it was not to be. At the start of the show the announcer confirmed that the role of Evita would be played by Jemma Rix. I had been warned by the program seller, so my disappointment wasn't as heartfelt or vocal as those hearing the news prior to the curtain rising. I truly felt for the audience but also for Jemma and did my own little "Go Jemma" cheer.

I can honestly say that by the end of the show, we were not disappointed in not seeing Tina as Eva. In fact, we were maybe even a little lucky to see the talented and beautiful Jemma sing, act and dance her heart out. She truly delivered a stellar performance, although others may not have shared our sentiments if the applause at the end was any indication.

The show is a revival of Hal Prince's original West End production from 1978. It stars Tina Arena and Jemma Rix as Eva Peron; Paulo Szot as Peron; Kurt Kansley as Che (an audience favourite) and making her professional debut Alexis Van Maanen as the Mistress. Alexis was mesmerising to watch and listen to, and this was all the more incredible as she graduated Caulfield Grammar School at the end of 2017 - less than twelve months ago.

With lyrics and music by Tim Rice and Sir Andrew Lloyd Webber, *Evita* tells the story of Eva Peron, born Maria Eva Duarte from



childhood to her death from cancer in 1952 aged 33. It quickly follows her rise from rags as an illegitimate child, to riches as wife of the Argentinian President Juan Peron. The costuming, orchestra and ensemble singing were magical and quite impressive. The show is coming to Melbourne shortly with Tina as lead and if you get the opportunity to attend, I'm sure you will enjoy it. However, for those who haven't seen Evita before, it is not a show that leaves you feeling on a high or singing and whistling as you head for home. Its story and mood is more dramatic and at times sombre, which is reflected on the stage.


